## I. Executive Summary

### I.A. PURPOSE

This report is submitted pursuant to s. 394.745, F.S., to document the performance of community behavioral health providers under contract with the Department of Children and Families (Department). It describes the compliance of substance abuse and mental health (SAMH) service providers with legislatively established annual performance outcome standards and corrective actions as a result of not achieving performance standards. The report includes:

- Performance outcome data collection process;
- Performance results; and
- Contract compliance and monitoring.

### I.B. SCOPE

This report addresses community behavioral health provider performance during Fiscal Year 2014-15. Performance for state mental health treatment facilities and non-Department funded services are not included.

### I.C. FINDINGS

Pursuant to s. 394.9082, F.S., the Department contracts with seven regional Managing Entities (MEs) to manage the delivery of behavioral health care through subcontracts with local network providers. Statewide, MEs and their network providers met or exceeded 14 of 18 targets (77.78%) for the legislatively established FY14-15 performance outcome standards.

## II. Data Submission

The Department requires MEs to submit client-level data electronically into the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Information System (SAMHIS). Data includes demographic and clinical characteristics of persons served, the services provided, and outcomes as defined in the Mental Health and Substance Abuse Measurement and Data Pamphlet I55-2, Version II.I.2.<sup>1</sup> Standard definitions and processes to calculate outcomes are detailed in the Performance Measurement Manual, Incorporated Document 19<sup>2</sup> of each ME's contract.

### III. Performance Results

#### III.A. STATE-LEVEL PERFORMANCE RESULTS

Tables 1 and 2 report statewide performance for mental health services and substance abuse services, respectively. Each table displays the performance measure, the associated target, goal direction, performance results, and whether or not the target was attained.

The MEs collectively met or exceeded 14 of 18 (77.78%) of performance targets for Fiscal Year 2014-15. MEs met or exceeded eight of eleven targets for mental health services. The targets that were not met are:

- Average annual days worked for pay for adults with severe and persistent mental illness;
- Percent of children with emotional disturbances who improve their level of functioning; and
- Percent of children with serious emotional disturbances who improve their level of functioning

### III.B. CONTRACT PERFORMANCE RESULTS

Table 3 below indicates the managing entity performance for mental health and substance abuse services as of 10/15/15<sup>3</sup>. The performance standards met or exceeded by the individual MEs varied from 12 of 18 (66.67%) to 15 of 18 (83.33%). None of the MEs met targets for all performance standards. Individual ME performance is detailed in Appendix A.

### IV.A. BIG BEND COMMUNITY BASED CARE

The COU report for Big Bend Community Based Care identified findings related to:

- Substance Abuse Prevention and Treatment Block Grant Administration; and
- Incident Reporting Processes and Documentation

CAPs addressing both findings were successfully completed and closed on September 9, 2015.

### IV.B. BROWARD BEHAVIORAL HEALTH COALITION

The COU report for Broward Behavioral Health Coalition identified findings related to:

- Subcontractor Performance Monitoring and Accountability;
- Fraud and Abuse Prevention Processes and Documentation;
- Assisted Living Facilities Case Management Monitoring;
- Substance Abuse Prevention and Treatment Block Grant Requirements; and
- Incident Reporting Processes and Documentation

CAPs addressing all findings were successfully completed and the CAPs were closed on April 3, 2015.

The COU report for Central Florida Behavioral Health Network identified no findings.

#### **IV.D. CENTRAL FLORIDA CARES HEALTH SYSTEMS**

The COU report for Central Florida Cares Health System identified a finding related to:

- Compliance with Monitoring Requirements in the Network Management Plan

A CAP addressing this finding remains active as of this report. Remaining tasks associated with the CAP are targeted for completion before November 1, 2015.

#### **IV.E. LUTHERAN SERVICES FLORIDA**

The COU report for Lutheran Services Florida identified findings related to:

- Required Elements of Subcontract Documents; and
- Inventory Tracking

Both findings were identified as non-systemic instances of non-compliance, applying to one subcontract and two inventoried items. The ME corrected both instances promptly. No CAPs were required.

#### **IV.F. SOUTH FLORIDA BEHAVIORAL HEALTH NETWORK**

The COU report for South Florida Behavioral Health Network identified findings related to:

- Incident Reporting Processes and Documentation; and
- Employment Eligibility Verification Documentation

Both findings were corrected through policy revision, rather than formal CAPs, and were conducted jointly by the Department and the ME with completion in April 20, 2015.

#### **IV.G. SOUTHEAST FLORIDA BEHAVIORAL HEALTH NETWORK**

The COU report for Southeast Florida Behavioral Health Network identified findings related to:

- Substance Abuse Prevention and Treatment Block Grant Administration;
- Required Subcontract Terms and Conditions;
- Quarterly Financial Statements in the Network Management Plan; and
- Employment Eligibility Verification Documentation

CAPs addressing the Block Grant and Subcontract findings remain active as of this report. The tasks associated with the CAPs are targeted for completion before March 1, 2016. No CAPs were required for the findings related to the Network Management Plan and Employment Documentation. Both issues were addressed by policy revisions completed prior to the issuance of the COU report.
