## ORLANDO AREA REFUGEE TASK FORCE MEETING

### INTRODUCTION

This meeting was held at Catholic Charities located at 1771 N. Semoran Blvd., Orlando, FL, 32807. Thirty-one people were in attendance. David Draper, Community Liaison Manager, represented the Florida Department of Children and Families, Refugee Services (RS) Program. Rosa Chaves, Community Liaison for the Central Region, was also present. Everyone introduced themselves and the agencies that they represented.

### SPECIAL PRESENTATION

I. **Agency for Health Care Administration AHCA Orlando – Tamyika Young Medical/Health Care Program Analyst, BUREAU OF MEDICAID RPA ORLANDO –**, provided an overview of the Medicaid program.

- Tamyika explained that Medicaid is an assistance program which provides health coverage to low-income families and individuals including children, parents, pregnant women, seniors, and people with disabilities.
- AHCA manages the Florida Medicaid Program while the Department of Children and Families (DCF) determines Medicaid eligibility through the ACCESS program.
- AHCA is also responsible for administering Statewide Medicaid Managed Care Program (SMMC) which has two components: Integrated the Managed Medical Assistance (MMA) with Long Term Care (LTC). They also have a dental program.
- DXC-Technology is the fiscal agent for Medicaid and manages Florida Medicaid Management Information System (FMMIS).
- Any individual can stay connected with AHCA through social media: Youtube, Facebook, and Twitter.

### GENERAL UPDATES/ ANNOUNCEMENTS

**Weam Jabbar from Women and Children Organization** states that they have free Health Immigration Fair on April 27, 2019 at UCF and at Marriot Hotel in May 24, 2019. They continue offering immigration consultation Tuesdays and Thursdays from 2:00-5:00 pm.

**Vesna Bozic, Community Relations Officer USCIS** introduced herself as the new USCIS Community Relations Officer for District 10, covering the greater Orlando, Jacksonville, and southern Georgia areas. She announced that USCIS accepted the invitation for our WRD event on June 22, 2019 and she is looking for approval to have a Naturalization Ceremony that coincides with the event.

**Pastor Gabriel Ipasu, President of African Community Outreach AFCO** states that their office is moving from OBT to Summit Church facilities at Colonial Drive. Also, they need sponsors for their refugee soccer team in Orlando.

**Felipe Rodriguez, Specialist in Diversity, Inclusion, and Equity Senior Specialist from Office of Multicultural Affairs City of Orlando** announced the Hispanic Office's (HOLA's) 15<sup>th</sup> anniversary event with Mayor Buddy Dyer was a great success.

**Wesline Archelus-Valentin, Haitian Coordinator for 4C in Pine Hills** announced a Haitian Health and Cultural Event on May 17<sup>th</sup>, 2019 from 3:00-5:00 pm at 2804 Belco Dr. Orlando, Fl. 32808.

**Fatima Ait Rami, Outreach Director from Icorlando** announced their Interfaith Ramadan event. She will send out dates.

**Inez Nazario-Vega, Founder and owner of B4G Academy** Announced their event on June 29<sup>th</sup>, 2019 at Volusia County. They have space for vendors. Vendors can communicate and make reservations to volusiachamber.com

**Salma A. Miranda, MHSa Trafficking Victims Assistant Program Case Manager from Bethany Christian Services of Florida** shared a flyer regarding services for victims of human trafficking.

**Debbie Vega, Director of Comprehensive Refugee Services with Catholic Charities (CC)** stated that they continue to see new Venezuelan asylee clients. Clients with Parole are seeing delays as they wait for their EADs. Case management has been busy serving new arrivals. English classes are being offered at the Orlo Vista site. Catholic Charities is offering pre-literacy classes on site. CC has been conducting outreach to Venezuelans to ensure they know about available services. The Catholic Charities food pantry is open to the public. The refugee employment program has been attending job fairs.

**David Draper, Community Liaison Manager from Department of Children and Families DCF** explained that most regions of the State are moving towards a Comprehensive Refugee Services model. Miami is the only area that will not utilize this service delivery model.

**Rosa Chaves, DCF Community Liaison for Central Florida** announced that Orlando's World Refugee Day event will be held at Summit Church and provided information about the event.
