The meeting was held via Microsoft Teams and Miriam Rosario, Southeast Region (SER) Community Liaison (CL), Refugee Services (RS) Program, Florida Department of Children and Families (DCF) facilitated the Refugee Task Force (RTF) meeting. Miriam thanked and welcomed all participants. The meeting was called to order and participants introduced themselves, services, and the agency they represented. Approximately 35 people were on the call.

SPECIAL PRESENTATIONS

Cultural Considerations for Afghan Refugees and Resettlement”: Dr. Adam Silverman, Technical Lead, Senior Subject Matter Expert, and National Security Consultant, Helios, Global Inc. The presentation was given by Dr Adam Silverman, who currently serves as technical lead, senior subject matter expert, and national security consultant with Helios Global, Inc and specializes in cultural considerations for strategy, policy, and operations. Claudia encourages all clients to be referred to the DCF Services Center and not to delay the application as the RS benefits are time limited. Refugee Services Program (RS/DCF) – Ileana Bustelo, RS Deputy Director updated on RS/DCF. Florida has experienced an increase of new arrivals in categories mostly from Cuba and Haiti. RS is monitoring as we continue with new developments.

Refugee task forces meetings will continue virtual via Microsoft meetings until further notice. Miriam thanks all for their collaboration and sharing all their resources.

RS Contracted providers:

Comprehensive Refugee Services (CRS); Gladys Sanchez CWS update on CRS services including the challenges of new cases with a longer wait time to obtain EAD. Francisco Figueroa, Program Administrator, CWS reported on the high increase of new arrival especially Cuban and Haitian. CRS is experiencing increases of new arrivals processing intake and increases in case management. CRS continue to provide referrals to adult education and services in the community. Gladys stated biggest challenges are getting the ESS/DCF (SNAP and benefits) ACCESS applications appointments on time. **Natalia Patino, Supervising Attorney** at Church World Service, updated reported on the CRS Legal Services.
