Threshold Criteria for Impeding Danger

Impending Danger

A <u>state of danger</u> in which family behaviors, attitudes, motives, emotions and/or situations pose a threat which may not be currently active but can be anticipated to have severe effects on a child at any time.

Danger Threshold: Criteria for Impending Danger

Observable: Can be behaviorally described in detail

Out of Control: No responsible adult can prevent/stop threat

Severe: Threat will likely result in severe harm to a child

Imminent: Threat will occur in the near to immediate future

Vulnerable Child: A child that is vulnerable to the threat

Clarifying and Qualifying the Danger Threshold

(Things to think about when considering the threshold)

- ➤ How long have family conditions been occurring? (Duration)
- ➤ How often do the family conditions happen? (Consistency)
- ➤ What is the extent of the family conditions? (Pervasiveness)
- ➤ What stimulates/contributes to the family conditions? (Influence)
- ➤ What is the impact on the family? (Impact)
- ➤ How likely is that family conditions will continue? (Continuance)
