Adults in or Formerly in Foster Care

DATE DUE: As soon as possible

PURPOSE: To highlight the change in age requirement for the tuition fee exemption. During the 2010 Session, the Legislature changed the age requirement to 28 for the tuition fee exemption for all eligible youth in and young adults formerly in foster care. To ensure that the youth and young adults that we serve are aware of this change and hopefully able to take advantage of this fee exemption, we have updated the Tuition and Fee Exemption for Students in Foster Care/Independent Living/Adoption form (Form CF-FSP 5220) and included this new change in age.

BACKGROUND: Section 1009.25(2)(c), F.S., establishes the eligibility criteria for a youth in or young adult formerly in foster care to be exempt from paying tuition and fees at a public postsecondary career program, public Florida College System Institution (including public community college), or public state university, pursuant to s. 1009.25(2)(c), F.S. The 2010 Legislature amended this section to establish the same exemption expiration date for all eligible youth in and young adults formerly in foster care. The exemption is now valid until a young adult reaches the age of 28.

The Department made changes to Form CF-FSP 5220 to reflect the legislative changes effective July 1. Please note the Legislature made no changes to the type of degree for which a young person may use this exemption. The Florida Board of Governors' regulation 7.008 stipulates this exemption is valid for an undergraduate degree or up to 120 hours.
