**SUBJECT:** Rapid Safety Feedback Updates – Strengthening Child Safety through Technology

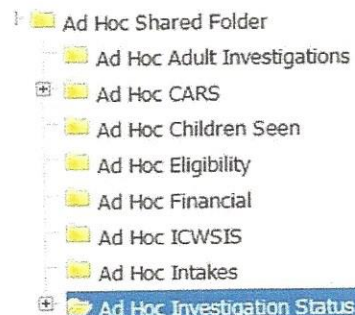
**PURPOSE:** The purpose of this memo is to announce updates to the Ad Hoc Daily V3B Child Investigations and Special Conditions Listing report that supports Rapid Safety Feedback Reviews.

**BACKGROUND:** The Strengthening Child Safety through Technology project released on March 24, 2017 introduced new maltreatment values that are included in the criteria for Rapid Safety Feedback. The Ad Hoc report that supports this process has a filter (input control) that is used to identify investigations containing both Family Violence and Substance Misuse maltreatments. This filter has been updated, to include the three new maltreatments:

- Household Violence Threatens Child
- Intimate Partner Violence Threatens Child
- Substance Exposed Newborn

The new version of the report will be named **Daily V4MK Child Investigations and Special Conditions Listing.**

The report has been moved from the Child Investigations folder to the Ad Hoc Shared folder within the Ad Hoc Investigations Status sub-folder. Users can also find the report by searching 'V4MK.'
