

# SUD Provider Search Fact Sheet



The Department's new Substance Use Disorder Provider Database ([Substance Use Disorder Licensing and Regulation | Florida DCF](#)) offers one place to verify Substance Use Disorder provider licensing in Florida that is faster, clearer, and more user-friendly than previously available.

## What the New Tool Offers:

### Clear licensing details

Improved provider visibility by grouping each provider's sites and components under a consolidated listing, allowing the user an at-a-glance view of the status of each license (probationary, regular, interim) and the ability to drill down into site-specific information including licensing applications, inspection reports, and administrative actions.

### One Simple Search

Look up a provider and see all of their licensed services in one place.

### Interactive Map

Quickly find provider locations and confirm facility addresses.

### Mobile-Friendly Access

A mobile-friendly tool that works on phones, tablets, and computers, with a layout that automatically adjusts to your screen.
