

Extended Foster Care (EFC) Program
Termination and Redetermination Reason
FSFN Guidance

FSFN Termination Reason	Explanation
Achieved Permanency	This reason is supported by the successful completion of goals outlined in the transition and case plan. NOTE: Permanency for a young adult in EFC is transition to independence.
Aged Out	This reason is used when the young adult turns 21 (22 with a disability), is categorically ineligible to continue, and has not achieved permanency.
Deceased	This reason is supported by a death certificate.
Eligibility Change to Aftercare Services	Use when a young adult is or becomes incarcerated and a subsequent Aftercare Services case is opened in efforts to transition the young adult into EFC or PESS.
Eligibility Change to PESS	Use when a young adult voluntarily opts out of EFC to enter PESS. The termination is supported by CF-FSP 5375, My Decision to Leave Extended Foster Care.
No Longer in Qualifying Activity	Use when the young adult must be terminated for failure to participate in a qualifying activity.
No Longer in an Approved Supervised Living Arrangement	Use when the young adult must be terminated for failure to reside in a supervised living arrangement in accordance with CF-FSP 5431, Supervised Living Arrangement Assessment for Extended Foster Care and CF-FSP 5430, Shared Living Plan for Extended Foster Care.
Not Adhering to Program Requirements as Agreed Upon	DO NOT USE
Voluntary Opt Out	This reason is supported by CF-FSP 5375. The young adult has made the decision to leave EFC or opt out of the program.

FSFN Redetermination Reason	Explanation
Change in qualifying activity	The reason is used when the young adult changes their activity from school to work or vice versa.
Dual Enrollment EFC/PESS	DO NOT USE
Verification of qualifying activity (standard redetermination)	This reason is supported with documents verifying the young adult's participation in a qualifying activity during the annual review period.
